



## BEVERLY HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT APRIL 2020 SUMMARY FOR MONTHLY REPORT

#### **Crime Summary:**

During the month of April, we saw no change in violent crime and only had four (4) more property crimes than March 2020. During April, the crime that contributed the most to the property crime increases were Residential Burglaries. However, of the 17 Residential Burglaries, four (4) were breach to an inhabited dwelling. We had one (1) more Robbery, in which we made an arrest, in April compared to March 2020. Overall, total crime is down 16% year-to-date. Our response time to emergency calls for service was lowered to 2.15 minutes and we received 2,225 "911" calls; which, is 989 less than March 2020.

#### **Significant Accomplishments:**

- We continued to be an integral part of our Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- We sent out numerous Temporary Standard Operations Procedures to our department personnel regarding our COVID-19 response.
- The Beverly Hills Police Department, through the EOC, has created a COVID-19 Hotline (310-550-4860) for community members. The Hotline is staffed Monday Friday (9am 6pm).
- The Department temporarily pulled most of our resources (including Traffic and the Crime Impact Team) into Patrol and deployed a modified staffing schedule to better adapt to COVID-19 and keep our employees healthy; meanwhile, still providing the same level of service to our community served.
- We have made significantly more arrests in 2020 as compared to 2019 and have also seen large traffic enforcement citation increases in 2020 as compared to 2019.

#### **Crime Prevention:**

- Our Community Relations Unit posted several Community Public Service Announcement videos on our department's YouTube channel and Nixle regarding our COVID-19 response (i.e., Face Coverings, Dispatchers Week, Donations to BHPD and Community Appreciation).
- We orchestrated and facilitated "Applause to Cedars" with outside agencies and circulated motorcade through social media platforms.
- We conducted several home security inspections
- We deployed Foot Beat Officers and Bicycle Patrol Officers within our business districts and parks in an effort to be highly visible to our community during the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### **Detective Bureau:**

Detectives arrested a subject involved in an armed robbery of a driver who was seated in his car. Additionally, a search warrant was conducted with the assistance from BHPD SWAT for additional evidence that may have been located at the residence. The investigative lead came from our City CCTV cameras that captured the license plate involved in the crime.

#### **Geographical Policing:**

- During the month of April, officers were briefed on focusing their efforts on educating the public and how to comply with social distancing and the face covering ordinance.
- Officers were directed to focus their efforts in the early morning hours to prevent Burglaries and Thefts from Motor Vehicle.
