

Beverly Hills Police Department Executive Summary - November 2023

Crime Summary

In November 2023, we saw a **19**% decrease in offenses¹ compared to October 2023. Overall total offenses are up by **23**% **year-to-date.** We have had five hundred and thirty-two crimes thus far in 2023 compared to 2022. Our response time to emergency calls for service is 2.54 minutes, and we received 4,088 community-generated calls for service.

Community Engagement

- In November 2023, the Community Relations Unit (CRU) Supervisor Sergeant Newman played a pivotal role in enhancing public safety awareness, presenting important announcements and resources to the Trousdale Homeowners Association alongside City Council and other key members of the City of Beverly Hills. In a separate initiative, Sgt. Newman addressed the Beverly Hills Chamber of Commerce with a presentation focused on Business Safety during the Holidays, emphasizing the importance of security and vigilance during this busy season.
- BHPD's social media platforms continued to be an effective tool for community engagement and information dissemination. Highlights included:
 - o A post acknowledging the dedicated personnel of the BHPD's Records Bureau during Law Enforcement Records Personnel Week.
 - o Celebrating the graduation of three BHPD recruits from the LAPD Academy.
 - o A media release about an attempted murder suspect which reached over 12,600 accounts on Instagram.
 - Sharing news on the arrest of key suspects in a series of high-profile armed robberies across LA and Orange Counties, reaching over 8,300 accounts on Instagram.
- CRU made their fourth visit to the Pediatrics Unit at Cedars-Sinai, meeting with patients and reinforcing their commitment to community care and support.
- Participation in the Rodeo Drive Holiday Lighting Event showcased the CRU's involvement in local festivities and public events, further strengthening community bonds.
- Demonstrating their dedication to community safety, CRU conducted significant security assessments for two HOAs.
- CRU hosted Team Beverly Hills, providing an engaging presentation and a comprehensive tour of the Police Department. This event was well attended, with over 50 residents and several representatives from local businesses, offering an insightful look into the operations and roles within the Police Department.
- The BHPD Police Explorer Program held trainings on First Aid, CPR, and Tourniquet Application. Because of these trainings, some of BHPD's Police Explorers are now certified through the American Heart Association. We are continuously accepting applications for the Police Explorer Program. Investigative Services Division

On November 27, 2023, a distraction theft occurred, resulting in a staggering loss of \$85,000. The investigation efforts of the Crime Impact Team (CIT) and detective personnel involved a large surveillance operation leading to detectives observing the suspects commit an additional crime amounting to a loss of \$7,245. On November 30, 2023, seven suspects were arrested, and a search warrant was served at a location connected to the suspects. Felony charges were subsequently filed against all seven arrestees, including violations of Penal Code sections 487 (grand theft), 459 (burglary), and 182 (conspiracy).

Traffic Bureau

- In November 2023, Traffic Control Officers (TCOs) issued 5,886 parking citations, 355 signed citations, and 2,363 Photo Red Light citations.
- On November 13th, the TCOs did parking enforcement on specific areas of complaint and areas of high parking violations. The TCOs wrote approximately 403 parking citations that day.
- On November 16th, Traffic Bureau personnel assisted with crowd management at the annual holiday lighting ceremony on Rodeo Drive.
