



ASSAULT	Assault – Aggravated	An assault with a weapon or with the intent to inflict severe or aggravated bodily injury.

# BEVERLY HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT JUNE 2020 SUMMARY FOR MONTHLY REPORT

#### **Crime Summary:**

During the month of June, we had less (-26) property crimes than May 2020. We did see an increase in violent crime (+8) in which we made eight arrests. We continued to see delayed reporting during the month of June 2020 due to the civil unrest and looting that took place throughout the city on Saturday, May 30<sup>th</sup>. Overall, total crime is still down **15**% year-to-date. Our response time to emergency calls for service increased to 3.13 minutes as a result of the redeployment of patrol resources to handle the civil unrest and multiple protests throughout the City during the month of June. We received 2,768 "911" calls; which, is 216 more than May 2020. A majority of these calls were related to the civil unrest and protests in the City during the month of June.

#### **Significant Accomplishments:**

- The entire department went on a Tactical Alert schedule to handle the civil unrest and protests in the City. This resulted in shifts of 12 hours ON and 12 hours OFF (with no days off). We stayed on this schedule for a large portion of the month.
- We continued to be an integral part of our Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Beverly Hills Police Department, through the EOC, has created a COVID-19 Hotline (310-550-4860) for community members. The Hotline is staffed Monday Friday (9am 6pm).
- We made significantly more arrests (44%) in June 2020 as compared to May 2020 and have also seen large traffic enforcement citation increases (239%) in June 2020 as compared to May 2020.

#### **Crime Prevention:**

- Our Community Relations Unit (CRU) conducted two residential security inspections.
- In addition, the CRU had two virtual community meetings and one virtual Health and Safety meeting.

#### **Detective Bureau:**

- Our Detectives and Crime Impact Team joined the SAFE LA Task Force with LAPD, FBI, Santa Monica PD and several other agencies with the goal of identifying and arresting those responsible for both violent and property crimes committed during the civil unrest and rioting beginning on May 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020.
- A suspect was taken into custody in the 100 block of S Beverly Dr for a sexual assault. A detective follow-up was conducted which resulted in two filings for sexual assault.

#### **Geographical Policing:**

- During the month of June, patrol officers continued to be deployed to several areas of civil unrest in both commercial and residential areas.
- Additional staffing was put in place to respond and monitor large scale, civil unrest events.
- On Friday, June 26, officers arrested twenty-five protesters in violation of the new "Emergency Ordinance: Assemblies in Residential Zone" BHMC 20-O-2813.

#### **Traffic Deployments:**

During the month of June, Motor Officers were reassigned to patrol to help quell the civil unrest and looting that took place throughout the city.
