












Crime Category	Sub-Category	Description
ASSAULT	Assault – Aggravated	An assault with a weapon or with the intent to inflict severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assault – Simple	An assault with no intent and not resulting in severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assaults – Prior to Sept 2018	All aggravated and simple assaults (previously combined).
BURGLARY	Burglary – Commercial Building	Entry into a commercial business after business hours with the intent to commit theft
	Burglary – Construction Site	Any entry onto a construction site with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Accessed Garage Only)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a garage (subterranean, attached to residence, detached from residence) with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Home Occupied)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony while the residence is occupied at the time of the crime.
	Burglary – Residential (Common Area)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a common mail area or laundry room of a multi-family residence with the intent to commit mail theft or coin theft.
	Burglary – Residential (No One Home)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony when no one is home at the time of the crime.
DUI ARREST		The arrest of a person for driving while under the influence of any alcoholic beverage or drug.

BEVERLY HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT DECEMBER 2019 SUMMARY FOR MONTHLY REPORT

Crime Summary:

During the month of December, we saw a decrease in Robberies (17%). We were down one (6 to 5) from November 2019. Overall, there was a decrease in violent crimes (18%). However, during the month of December, we saw an increase in property crime (29%). The 35 additional crimes that made up the 29% increase were mainly attributed to an uptick in Grand Thefts. We had nine (9) additional Vehicle Burglaries compared to last month. The other related crimes that contributed to the increase were Larceny Thefts; specifically, Grand Thefts from within our business district.

Crime Prevention:

We deployed a robust Holiday anti-theft	campaign during the n	nonth of December.	This included:
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Daily foot beat officers and bicycle patrol officers within our business districts
Holiday safety tips (e.g., Package Theft Prevention Tips and Home Security Tips) which included
recent crime trends we are experiencing
A crime prevention ad was placed in our local newspapers and social media
Technology based deployments, bait bicycle and decoy police vehicles as force multipliers
