


Acceptable Exterior Building and Sidewalk Washing Guidelines During Water Conservation

<u>Using a Reclaimed Water System</u> - A Reclaimed Water System is a system that collects wash water, treats and reuses it for building washing. For exterior building washing, a "closed loop" cleaning and water recovery system meets the criteria of a reclaimed water system.

Limitations on Exterior Washdown of Buildings

- 1. No more than once (1) per month for retail building frontage.
- 2. No more than twice (2) per year for office and commercial buildings.
- 3. No more than necessary to comply with health laws, regulations for the building frontage of food services.
- 4. No more than once (1) per year for residential structures solely for the purpose of preparing a residential structure for painting.

For Windows - Use a commercial glass and window cleaner



<u>For Sidewalks</u> – Use a Reclaimed Water System and this should *not be done more often than is necessary to comply with health laws and regulations.*
