

### **Crime Summary:**

During November, we saw five more Violent Crimes (83%) and three less Property Crimes (-3%) compared to October 2020. Overall, total crime remains down at -23% year-to-date. In November, our response time to emergency calls for service was 2.50 minutes. We received 2,183 911 calls; 504 fewer than October 2020.

### **Significant Accomplishments:**

- Our City leadership team planned for over 10 weeks and implemented a comprehensive safety and security plan for Election Week. This included a maximum deployment of BHPD personnel), outside law enforcement assistance from the Santa Paula Police Department's SWAT Team and a public/private partnership with 80 armed private security guards.
- The EOC was activated for Election Week
- We continued to staff and monitor a recurring protest on Saturdays at the Beverly Gardens Park.
- Motor Vehicle Theft arrests are up **225%**.

#### **Crime Prevention:**

- Our Community Relations Unit (CRU) continues to work on the "Just in Case, BH" committee.
- The Beverly Hills Police Department's CRU has successfully implemented the Neighbors by Ring Application to connect with residents and improve the safety of the Beverly Hills' Community.

### **Detective Bureau:**

- Detectives identified and arrested a suspect following the Café Istanbul hate crime which occurred in the 300 block of S. Beverly Dr. The FBI and Beverly Hills' Detectives are continuing to investigate this crime and following up on additional involved suspects.
- An armed robbery occurred in the area of Canon Dr. and Brighton Way. Officers were later alerted to a wanted vehicle, which was ultimately stopped and its driver arrested. The investigation into the crime and the development of additional suspects is still continuing.
- A suspect from the May 2020 riots and looting was identified and arrested.
- All detective personnel were subject to the tactical alert issued department wide beginning on October 31<sup>st</sup> and lasting through November 14<sup>th</sup>. Detective personnel assisted with election related protests and rallies during this time.

#### **Geographical Policing:**

- Our Geographical Policing (GP) Officers have an ongoing security collaboration with businesses during this holiday season.
- The GP officers continue to collaborate with private security contractors on developing an integrated public safety model that adds another layer of security and protection for the residents and business community.
- Using department resources to address crime hot spots in the City such as the deployment of our mobile CCTV trailers, the use of our plain clothes detectives in our Crime Impact Team and the implementation of high visibility patrols with our security contractors.

### **Traffic Deployments:**

Motor Officers have continued their enforcement efforts in areas where traffic collisions are prevalent. This has resulted in a significant decrease in vehicle collisions to include injury collisions (no fatal collisions thus far in 2020). They have also focused on parking enforcement, which led to an 82% increase of parking citations year-to-date.

Crime Category	Sub-Category	Description
ASSAULT	Assault – Aggravated	An assault with a weapon or with the intent to inflict severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assault – Simple	An assault with no intent and not resulting in severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assaults – Prior to Sept 2018	All aggravated and simple assaults (previously combined).
BURGLARY	Burglary – Commercial Building	Entry into a commercial business after business hours with the intent to commit theft
	Burglary – Construction Site	Any entry onto a construction site with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Accessed Garage Only)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a garage (subterranean, attached to residence, detached from residence) with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Home Occupied)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony while the residence is occupied at the time of the crime.
	Burglary – Residential (Common Area)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a common mail area or laundry room of a multi-family residence with the intent to commit mail theft or coin theft.
	Burglary – Residential (No One Home)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony when no one is home at the time of the crime.
