

#### **Crime Summary:**

During October, we saw six less Violent Crimes (-50%) and 24 additional Property Crimes (+31%) compared to September 2020. Overall, total crime is still down at -14% year-to-date. Our response time in October to emergency calls for service decreased to the lowest level since 2011 at 1.53 minutes. We received 2,687 "911" calls; which, is 111 less than September 2020.

### **Significant Accomplishments:**

- Our City leadership team planned for over 10 weeks and implemented a comprehensive safety and security plan for Election Week. This included the maximum deployment of all BHPD officers (including Command Staff), outside law enforcement assistance from the Santa Paula Police Department SWAT Team and a public/private partnership with 80 armed private security guards.
- We activated the EOC for Election Week
- We continue to staff and monitor a recurring USA Freedom Rally protest on Saturday's at the Beverly Gardens Park.
- We saw a decrease in Robberies (-4).

#### **Crime Prevention:**

- Our Community Relations Unit (CRU) presented to the Human Relations Commission, Health & Safety Commission, the Rodeo Drive Committee, and the Convention and Visitor's Bureau regarding our Election Week preparations.
- Our CRU continues to work on the "Just in Case, BH" committee.
- We celebrated the retirement of Sgt. Sean Smollen (Community Relations Sergeant).

#### **Detective Bureau:**

- Property Crimes Detectives arrested two additional suspects who were involved in burglaries and looting on Rodeo Drive during the May 30<sup>th</sup> civil unrest.
- Detectives continue to work with our Federal partners on the investigations regarding the EDD fraud.
- Financial Crimes Detectives identified a suspect wanted in connection with numerous fraudulent wire transfers and bank fraud occurring in many parts of the Western United States. An extradition warrant was obtained and the case has been adopted by the Federal Authorities.
- Detective personnel took part in mobile field force training in preparation for Election Week.

### **Geographical Policing:**

- Our Geographical Policing (GP) Officers met with residents from the south east portion of the city via Zoom to discuss crime and civil unrest. 28 Neighborhood watch yard signs were provided.
- GP Officers continue to foster their partnership with other City Departments and continue to do Homeless Outreach sweeps in the City's local parks with Community Services.

#### **Traffic Deployments:**

- Our Motor Officers have focused on high vehicle collision areas in town all year. This has resulted in a significant decrease in vehicle collisions to include injury collisions (no fatal collisions thus far in 2020).
- Our TCO's continue to focus on parking enforcement in between the protest and rally deployments. As a result, our parking citations have increased by an additional 2408 compared to 2019.

ASSAULT	Assault – Aggravated	An assault with a weapon or with the intent to inflict severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assault – Simple	An assault with no intent and not resulting in severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assaults – Prior to Sept 2018	All aggravated and simple assaults (previously combined).
BURGLARY	Burglary – Commercial Building	Entry into a commercial business after business hours with the intent to commit theft
	Burglary – Construction Site	Any entry onto a construction site with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Accessed Garage Only)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a garage (subterranean, attached to residence, detached from residence) with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Home Occupied)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony while the residence is occupied at the time of the crime.
	Burglary – Residential (Common Area)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a common mail area or laundry room of a multi-family residence with the intent to commit mail theft or coin theft.
