

BEVERLY HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT EXECUTIVE SUMMARY JUNE 2021

Crime Summary:

During June 2021, we saw a 9% decrease in overall crime compared to May 2021. Overall, total crime still remains down at -7% year-to-date. We have had 108 less crimes committed thus far in 2021. Our response time to Emergency Calls for Service was 2.41 minutes and we received 3,187 Community Generated Calls for Service during June 2021.

Significant Accomplishments:

- Residential Burglaries were down (-5)
- Aggravated Assaults were down (-6)
- Overall violent arrests are up 87% (+53). This is led by Robbery and Aggravated Assaults arrests at 63% (+20) and 126% (+34) respectively.

Community Engagement:

A "Just in Case" ZOOM meeting for the southeast portion (Zone 8) was held on June 16^{th.}

Detective Bureau:

- On May 28th, 2021, an armed robbery occurred in the 300 block of South Elm Drive where a high-end watch was forcibly taken from the victim. The suspects fled in a vehicle but the license plate was captured on a camera during the suspect's escape. Detectives followed up on the suspect's license plate and enlisted the assistance of the Crime Impact Team. On June 18th, 2021, the suspects were observed again in the City of Beverly Hills and an active surveillance was established. The suspects attempted to rob another victim where their attempt was thwarted and they were arrested for both crimes.
- Between June 25th and June 27th, a residence in the 700 block of North Alta Drive was targeted several times by the same suspect for a residential burglary. During the commission of one of those crimes, the suspect was arrested by BHPD patrol officers and detectives were called to assist in locating property stolen by the suspect. With the assistance of the Crime Impact Team, all the stolen items were recovered from the suspect's residence and returned to the victim.
- On June 29th, 2021, a suspect known to BHPD detectives in several active vehicle burglary cases was observed in the City of Beverly Hills. The Crime Impact Team assisted the lead detective in conducting an active surveillance where he was seen committing another vehicle burglary. He was promptly arrested and charged with multiple counts of vehicle burglary. This arrest will clear over ten (10) vehicle burglary cases in the City of Beverly Hills and several others in the surrounding jurisdictions.

Geographical Policing:

- On June 2nd, the Geographical Policing Officers attended a Public Safety Walk in LA (8580 Burton Way) regarding homeless encampments.
- On June 3rd, a Zoom meeting with other City Departments was held to discuss the City owned Parking Facility located neared the Maybourne Hotel on Canon Drive.
- On June 8th, the Geographical Policing Officers attended the monthly homeless collaboration meeting with other City and County Departments.
- On June 23rd, the Geographical Policing Team attended a community service monthly meeting in which they discussed the opportunity to add a Bike Team to the Park Rangers and organize a response team to address habitual offenders.

Traffic Division:

- During June 2021, our Traffic Bureau issued 10,039 parking citations.
- Parking Citations are up 38% (+25,616) year-to-date.





Crime Category	Sub-Category	Description
ASSAULT	Assault – Aggravated	An assault with a weapon or with the intent to inflict severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assault – Simple	An assault with no intent and not resulting in severe or aggravated bodily injury.
	Assaults – Prior to Sept 2018	All aggravated and simple assaults (previously combined).
BURGLARY	Burglary – Commercial Building	Entry into a commercial business after business hours with the intent to commit theft
	Burglary – Construction Site	Any entry onto a construction site with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Accessed Garage Only)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a garage (subterranean, attached to residence, detached from residence) with intent to commit theft.
	Burglary – Residential (Home Occupied)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony while the residence is occupied at the time of the crime.
	Burglary – Residential (Common Area)	Entry <u>limited</u> to a common mail area or laundry room of a multi-family residence with the intent to commit mail theft or coin theft.
	Burglary – Residential (No One Home)	Entry into a residence with the intent to commit a theft or any felony when no one is home at the time of the crime.
